HOW TO SUCCEED IN GOD'S PERSPECTIVE

Philippians 3:12-21 (April 14, 2024)

- Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already arrived at my goal,
 but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me.
 Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But
- one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.
- ¹⁵ All of us, then, who are mature should take such a view of things. And if on some point you think differently, that too God will make clear to you.
- ¹⁶ Only let us live up to what we have already attained.
- ¹⁷ Join together in following my example, brothers and sisters, and just as you have us as a model, keep your eyes on those who live as we do.
- ¹⁸ For, as I have often told you before and now tell you again even with tears, many live as enemies of the cross of Christ.
- ¹⁹ Their destiny is destruction, their god is their stomach, and their glory is in their shame. Their mind is set on earthly things.
- ²⁰ But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ,
- ²¹ who, by the power that enables him to bring everything under his control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body.

Paul's Pattern for Successful Living

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¹²⁻¹³ Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect... I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. **Philippians 3:12-13**

I don't claim that I have already succeeded or become perfect. (Good News Bible)

¹³ You will never succeed in life if you try to hide your sins. Confess them and give them up; then God will show mercy to you. **Proverbs 28:13**

- ¹³ But this one thing I do; forgetting what is behind... **Philippians 3:13b**
- ¹⁸ Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See I am doing a new thing!" (says the Lord) **Isaiah 43:18**

What to Forget	:
